Isaac has complex support needs, but he's living a typical and ordinary life in his own home. In this podcast, Sheree, Isaac's mum talks about the myths they have busted along the way.



Brodie Moves Out!

Brodie moved out of his family's home in his mid-twenties and shares with a housemate. When Brodie first moved out, his mother Justine had lots of concerns as Brodie has a disability: Could Brodie do it? Was he ready? How would she manage his supports from a distance? In this podcast, Justine shares her fears and what she did to overcome them.

Home as a Safeguard for My Daughters

Bobby Noone talks about the things that she has put in place to ensure her daughters, Tammy and Kelli, are safe and happy, and that they continue to be so when she is no longer around. Bobby knows that the things that keep Tammy and Kelli safe include having a home of their own that is close to important people and places.
